MONDAY NIGHT RACE SERIES

We will have a Monday night race league this year and we have some changes. The current outline follows: We will again use AdminSports for racer registration and lift tickets. NO exception: registration will be through them. Art Dutra (Mt. Laurel) is working on an outline for AdminSports online registration — we will try to post on our CSC website. If you are new to this league, you must also register with NASTAR. If you have done NASTAR before, you just need to know your NASTAR number to be included with the AdminSports registration. Everyone should also know their permanent number — this is a number assigned by the CSC (me) to all your racers. It does not change year-to-year. If you have raced in the series before, you can look up your number on past race results OR contact me at skicouncil@gmail.com.

We will have pizza on Monday nights. It will be from the pizza truck. Details for ordering will be announced at the next CSC meeting.

Steps for Racers:

STEP 1: The yearly registration season waivers will be through AdminSports. The yearly waiver will be required BEFORE you register for any individual races. Please note: Required fields for on-line sign-up include your permanent number and your NASTAR number (see paragraph above).

STEP 2: Lift ticket/race sign-up, done every week, will be on-line from Friday up to noon on the day of the weekly race. This is required for racer registration each week prior to the race. No racer will be allowed to show up the day of a race and race without the weekly preregistration.

BIBS: We hand out CSC bibs for the year, at the first time a racer shows up at Mount Southington. Racers will be responsible to bring their bib each week. First come, first served to get your bib; HOWEVER, as in the past, each week we will pull a lottery number to determine who runs down the courses first. Each week will be the same bib sequence order, but the first racer number will vary.

Spring Picnic 2023

Spring Picnic 2023 planning has started. I'd like to begin some preliminary brainstorming soon. Men born in 1957 and prior (65+), women, and all snowboarders will have bibs 1-199. Men born 1958 and later (64 and under) will have bibs 200-399. Racers MUST turn in their bibs at the end of the season.

NEW this year: the top 2 oldest ages classes, Men N (73-77), Men O (78+) and Women H (69-75), Women I (76+) will run first on their course in the order they get to the start, prior to the lottery start number.

TICKETS: The process is outlined in Step 2. On-line ticket sales will eliminate money/credit card interaction. Ticket/racing prices increased slightly:

Race ticket - \$35; Race ticket with NASTAR - \$45; Race ticket with season pass - \$25; Race ticket with season pass AND NASTAR - \$35. This does not include the AdminSports fee. NASTAR is included with the normal runs, only if you want to practice on the NASTAR course do you need to sign up for NASTAR (skiers far right course.) Tickets will be handed out by Mount Southington at the ticket window, so there should be no issues entering the area with skis.

Monday Night 8 week race series dates:

Dec. 19 and 26; Jan. 2, 9, 16, 23 and 30; Feb. 6. Make-up dates: Feb. 13 and 20.
