## MONDAY NIGHT RACE SERIES

#### Monday night schedule:

**8-week race series: race dates:** Dec. 19 and 26 (both cancelled); Jan. 2, 9, 16, 23, 30; Feb. 6, and the make-up dates of Feb. 13 and 20 will be used. The first two races were cancelled, our series is now at the maximum of 8 weeks, we will use our make-up dates. Any more cancellations will reduce the total number in the 8-week series. We hope for cold temps and snowmaking for our next scheduled Monday night. A reminder, we will use AdminSports for racer registration and lift tickets<u>. *No exception*</u>. This year the deadline for registration has been extended to Monday noon of race day. If a racer is on the fence due to work or weather – this will help the CSC and the mountain make sure all have registered with AdminSports.

This is the 50<sup>th</sup> year for our Monday night series. We will have CSC Monday racing shirts that will be handed out to any racer who has raced four nights or more, as well as prizes each and every Monday night. Pizza will be available from the outside pizza truck – refer to the CSC racing web page to see the contact to order pizza in advance.

For new racers, please make sure your club guides you through the AdminSports registration process. Do not sign up too far in advance, as it makes it difficult for us to do any corrections or adjustments – and we want you to be happy!

Bibs will be handed out the first night at Mount Southington when a racer races. Racers will be responsible to bring their bib each week. We will assign the bib numbers and as in the past, each week we will pull a lottery number to determine who runs down the courses first. Each week will be the same bib sequence order, varied by the lottery number pulled for the first racer. **NEW this year**: the 2 oldest classes in both men and women are entitled to run before all others. This is Men N (73-77), Men O (78+) and Women H (69-75), Women I (76+ .) There were only 12 racers in this category last year, so it should be a minimum delay. Bibs 1-199 will be men 64 and under on skiers left course; and bibs 200-399 (skiers right course) will be men 65 and over, women and snowboarders.

A reminder: Racers MUST turn in their bibs at the end of the season, or on their last race night. Your club will be charged \$30 if your bib is lost or not turned in.

The lodge is open for us this year. You do not have to put on your boots in your car – you still can, but you don't have to.

I hope everybody has a great holiday – and wish for snow, or at least cold in the upcoming year.

- ✓ Due to budget constraints, food will not be provided by the Council. It will be available at the mountain.
- ✓ In the event of cancellation, all registration money will be returned.
