MONDAY NIGHT RACE SERIES

Hello racers!

As of this printing, the last Monday night race is February 20 – that will make a full 8-week series of races for the 50th anniversary season of Monday Night Racing.

At week #7, New Haven is in first with an insurmountable lead at 4759 points; Newington is 2nd with 3724; Mt. Laurel is third with 2936; fourth, Danbury Ski Club with 1490; and 5th, Hamden Ski Club with 1298. New Haven has dominated the Monday night series, jumping out with an early lead and staying in front all the way!

The last Monday night will hopefully see all of the bibs collected. If they are not turned in that night, your club will be responsible to replace it.

It has been a very warm season, but Mount Southington has done an extraordinary job of keeping the snow on the hill. Southington was able to make snow the Friday before our last race so that we could go out with a bang. There are still some good snow conditions out there; I hope you find some in northern locations.

The 50th anniversary awards for Monday night will be handed out at a party at the mountain on Monday, March 6, two weeks after the last race. All are invited to celebrate the end of the Monday night racing season; please plan to be there. Ron Kapraszewski and Lynn Swanson have been organizing and handing out swag during the race season. Also, the CSC and Ron & Lynn have purchased T-shirts with the CSC logo and 50th year celebration for anyone who has raced for four or more times. The shirts will be handed out for free.

Last year the Monday night series averaged 97 racers for the 8-week program. This year we increased participation (only counting 7 weeks to date) to an average of 117 racers, an increase of 18% - great progress!

We can only hope that next year will allow all the CSC events - the State races, the Winter Carnival (OnSnow) and the CT Senior Winter Games to return to our racing calendar.

Think snow, or at least think cold!

The deadline for registration was January 20, which later was extended to January 27. 63 children signed up for the lessons and lift tickets. Two children cancelled before the event due to illness. Out of 61 children there were eleven no-shows. I suspect that the cold weather was the main reason. I really appreciate the many offers of help on the day of the event, but with limits on attendance and no party after, there was no need for volunteers at this year's Kids' Day.

I had to work double shift for the Intro to Racing Program, so I want to thank Jonathan Houck and Krzysztof Lompart for the help given in the distribution of the lift tickets. Mountain Room provided us a dedicated table in a warm environment. New Britain Falcons Ski Club provided hot coffee and donuts.

Mount Southington did their usual great job in providing discounted lift tickets for both our kids and accompanying adults, as well as quality instructors for our kids. A warm thank you to Andrea and Posi and the entire staff at the mountain!

In summary, we had 61 children participating, with 15 clubs represented. We were able to provide all of our registrants a quality skiing experience with staying at about 75% of budget allotted for the event. The following clubs signed up: Electric Boat Ski & Snowboard Club, AE Ski Club, Norwich Ski Club, CT Soul Ski Club, Ski Bears, Danbury Ski Club, Winterset Ski, New Haven Ski Club, Mt Laurel Skiers, and New Britain Falcons Ski & Golf Club.
