CSC Racing Age Classes

The 2018 racing season has ended. Next year the CSC is looking to change the age classes for Monday Night Racing, which will also reflect age changes for the State races. Historically, the CSC has tried to make the age classes never more than 15 people per class, based on the current racing year's participation. We have had increasing numbers of participants the last four years:

In 2015, there were 810 racer starts
In 2016, there were 843 racer starts
In 2017, there were 1165 racer starts
In 2018, there were 1070 racer starts
The last Monday night of 2017 peaked at 205 racers.

The racing league has been growing. It is great to see the competition! However, some of the age groups do not have sufficient participants to have competition. Example: Women Class E 43-50 only had 6 racers all season, and the first place winner only skied 3 times; therefore, the age group should expand. Some age groups should be adjusted smaller: Men M 61-63 had 20 participants. There is one group in which 12 guys have the same birth year — a very competitive group; the age group should be adjusted.

I will assemble a suggested age breakdown and present it at the first CSC meeting next season. Just a heads up.
